

INTRODUCTION

Founded in 1985 by the late University of the Philippines (UP) President Edgardo J. Angara, the UP Center for Integrative and Development Studies (UP CIDS) is the University's policy research unit that aims to address problems of national significance by employing an integrative and collaborative approach in the conduct of studies on various aspects of public policy and harnessing the University's multidisciplinary expertise and expansive resources.

Based on then–UP President Angara's Executive Order No. 9 issued on 24 September 1985, UP CIDS has the following objectives and functions:

- Develop, organize, and manage research issues of national significance, for such issues, because of their importance and inherent complexity, require an integrative and collaborative approach and also more sophisticated research methodologies and skills;
- Encourage and support research and study on these issues by various units of the University and individual scholars;
- Secure funding from public and private persons and agencies; and
- Ensure that the research outputs and recommendations of the Center are published and openly disseminated.

UP CIDS is likewise guided by UP's Strategic Plan 2017-2023 and contributes to the University's thrust of (a) contributing to national development through knowledge creation and public service, and (b) promoting access and diversity through enhancing structures and policies for collaboration and undertaking internationalization efforts.

RESEARCH PROGRAMS

UP CIDS adopts a programmatic structure wherein a sizable network of scholars is brought together and organized under Research Programs through which a shared research agenda is pursued and networks within and outside the University are built upon.

Consistent with its integrative and collaborative approach, UP CIDS also provides opportunities and venues for the various Research Programs to work on common themes and emerging international and national policy concerns.

CORE STAFF

The UP CIDS Core Staff facilitates and supports the administration, finance, documentation, and dissemination of the Center's Research Programs' projects and activities. It coordinates with UP System offices and the UP CIDS Research Programs to effectively carry out its role and provide guidance and assistance on various matters.

The Core Staff is headed by the UP CIDS Executive Director and is housed in the UP CIDS Administrative Office. They are functionally organized into (1) Administration, (2) Finance, (3) Publications, and (4) Library and Resources.

POLICY RESEARCH AND A GOVERNANCE AGENDA FOR NATIONAL-BUILDING

For January to June 2022, UP CIDS continued its participation as co-sponsor of the Office of

the Chancellor University of the Philippines #PILIpiLUNAS2022: Pabangon at Pagsulong Tungo sa Magandang Buhay Bukas webinar series. The endeavor continued to pursue its two major activities: (1) agenda-building consisting of a series of roundtable discussions; and 2) the presentation of the #PILIpiLUNAS2022 Governance Agenda to the presidential candidates of the 2022 national elections.

#PILIpiLUNAS2022

The #PILIpiLUNAS2022 webinar series was led by UP CIDS's Political Economy Program (PEP), with its convenor Dr. Antoinette Raquiza, Chair of the UP Diliman Task Force on a Blueprint for Building the Nation.

- PILIpiLUNAS Webinar on "Pamumuhay sa Pagangat at Pagbangon ng Ekonomiya (Investing in Economic Recovery and Transformation)," which was participated in and cosponsored by UP CIDS Political Economy Program (PEP), 24 February 2022.
- 3. PILIpiLUNAS Webinar on "Pamumuhay Nang May Dignidad Para sa Lahat: A Webinar on Social Protection Floor," which was cosponsored by the University of the Philippines Center for Integrative and Development Studies (UP CIDS) Political Economy Program (PEP), 14 March 2022.
- #PILIpiLUNAS Webinar on Industrial Policy and Nation-Building, which was participated in and cosponsored by the University of the Philippines Center for Integrative and Development Studies (UP CIDS) Political Economy Program (PEP) and DZUP, 22 March 2022, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.
- 5. The #PILIpiLUNAS Governance Agenda: Public Launch, "Pag-angat at Pagsulong Tungo sa Magandang Buhay at Bukas" was the concluding webinar. The launch presented to the Philippine presidential candidates as well as to the public the highlights of the themes, issues and concerns of each of the webinars. This was part of the Executive Summary of the UP Diliman Task Force on Nation-Building's advocacy during and after the elections. Participating in this activity were

the following UP CIDS Programs that presented on behalf of their respective webinar series: (1) the Education Research Program; (2) the Program on Social and Political Change; and (3) the Political Economy Program.


The UP CIDS Library and Resources office opened physically partially to limited clients while maintaining its online services because of the the ongoing pandemic. The library's digitization project with the UP Diliman Main Library is in full swing and over 70% complete. The library's publication collection is now available on the newly revamped website of the Center. For the rest of 2022, the target is to reconnect with the library's partners while preparing for the fully physical reopening of the library.

UP CIDS also continued managing its administrative, financial, and legal records by digitizing and archiving the office records of the Center. Before the end of the first half of 2022, the Center has fully scanned and archived its inactive records, i.e., the oldest files found to 2012 and some of its semiactive records, i.e., 2013– 2017. For the remaining months of 2022, UP CIDS shall engage in quality checking and listing the scanned records while continuing the digitizing of the semiactive and active records.


MIDYEAR 2022 CONVENORS' MEETING








PROGRAM PERSONNEL ORIENTATION 2022

Education Research Program

The Education Research Program (ERP) conducts research under three categories: Curriculum and Assessment, Instruction and Teacher Development and Governance, and Finance and School Improvement. All are based on ERP's agenda, "Policy Investigations in Support of the Filipino Learner 2019–2024." To guide these investigations, studies draw on statistics, education studies, and multiple stakeholder consultations. For the current year, the particular focus of ERP is literacy, information communications technology (ICT), and disinformation.

ACTIVITIES FROM JANUARY TO JUNE 2022

WORKSHOP

Spotting Fake News Online (Batches 1–6) January 29, March 5, March 26, April 9, April 30, and May 6, 2022

Based on ERP's disinformation research, five online workshops on *Spotting Fake News Online* were held via Zoom. The first workshop was attended by 98 teacherparticipants. The second workshop had 250 participants, including members of the deaf community. The succeeding workshops were conducted in partnership with De La Salle Philippines. One hundred forty (140) participants attended the third workshop, which included members of two indigenous peoples' (IP) communities. Two hundred (200) and one hundred eighty (180) participants, respectively, attended the next two workshops. The final workshop was conducted face-to-face with 32 participants from the Tondo Community Initiative, a community-based nongovernmental organization (NGO) in Manila.

FORUM/WEBINARS Educating Beyond Employability: The Case of Philippine Seafarers March 30, 2022

In this forum, Dr. Roderick Galam from Oxford Brookes University presented his paper, "On the Assembly and Employability of Filipino Seafarers: Globalization, International Labour Migration, and the Global Regulation of Philippine Maritime Education." The forum was held via Zoom and organized in collaboration with the UP CIDS Higher Education Research and Policy Reform Program (HERPRP). Responses to the presentation were given by Assistant Director Samuel Soliven from the Department of Education (DepEd), Commodore Joel Abutal from Philippine Merchant Marine Academy, Atty. Jean Ver Pia from the Maritime Industry Authority, and President Sabino Czar Manglicmot II from the Philippine Association of Maritime Institutions.

FORUM/WEBINARS

#PilipiLunas 2022 Governance Agenda April 29, 2022

ERP Co-convenor Dr. Dina Ocampo served as a speaker on the governance agenda for higher education developed by the University of the Philippines Diliman.

The event was hosted by the UP CIDS Program on Social and Political Change (PSPC), in partnership with the UP Diliman Task Force Nation-Building, and copresented by the UP Department of Political Science and DZUP 1602. The event tackled three main points in addressing issues concerning higher education in the context of rapidly changing communities: (a) the perpetual challenges to access to and quality of higher education, (b) the need to change ways of teaching and learning in light of the COVID-19 pandemic and emerging technologies, and (c) strategies to create better connections across levels of education, as well as between private and higher education.

FORUM/WEBINARS

Special Lecture on Global Studies: Understanding the Vulnerabilities of Filipinos to Online Disinformation June 17, 2022

A special lecture on Global Studies was presented by ERP co-convenor, Dr. Lorina Calingasan. It examined the vulnerabilities of Filipinos to disinformation in online spaces, drawing on the insights and reflections from the *Spotting Fake News Online* workshop series. The event was organized by Ehime University Senior High School in Matsuyama, Japan, with 62 twelfth-grade participants.

CONFERENCE UNESCO: Asia-Pacific Region Education Ministers Conference

June 5-8, 2022

Dr. Dina Ocampo participated in the thematic session on Equity, Inclusion, and Gender Equality during the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural (UNESCO) Asia-Pacific Organization Education Ministers' Conference. This session presented and discussed key issues in the region about learning loss and recovery for disadvantaged and marginalized learners, especially because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Among the topics covered included the use of multilingual education, especially in linguistically diverse communities and countries to ensure the inclusion of all learners in education program delivery. As panel speaker, Dr. Ocampo shared insights on the design, implementation, and challenges of multilingual education programs in the Philippines. She highlighted the need for a commitment to children's linguistic rights, the necessary calibration of program design and implementation to the capacities of schools and teachers, and the logistical support that governments must give to inclusive, learner-centered programs.

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

For the rest of 2022, ERP will continue the next phases of its plans as envisioned in the projects' various research protocols/briefs. Areas to be pursued lie in the following strands: language and literacy studies, disinformation studies, and information and communications technology (ICT) for education research, as well as language capture, ethnography, and the coproduction of research, which are both components of the *UsapTayo* iteration of the TalkTogether project.

ACTIVITIES

Multi-Literacy Assessments for Filipino Children (Kindergarten to Grade 3) Multimodal Versions

Three versions of the Multi-Literacy Assessments for Filipino Children (MLAF) will be developed based on the results of statistical analyses and in consideration of different contexts of children. These versions will be for in-person, online, and telephony administration. Field trials will be conducted using these versions.

Roundtables on Grades 4 to 12 Assessments

These discussions are geared toward gathering input from public and private school teachers; DepEd Central, field, and school officials; academe; and other literacy experts regarding assessments for Grades 4 to 12. The roundtable shall begin with a plenary session followed by breakout discussions that will elicit information on domains to be assessed, existing assessments, challenges faced, solutions to issues, and other relevant aspects. The output of the roundtables will feed onto the development of the MLAF assessments for Grades 4 to 12.

Disinformation Studies in Education

Using the data gathered from previous workshops, researchers will produce outputs that will explore the competencies and literacies of both students and teachers in spotting fake news online. Also to be conducted are workshops on fighting disinformation that will serve as skillbuilding activities, as well as data collection in partnership with De La Salle Philippines.

Sipat Edukasyon

ERP will conduct its annual research dissemination forum, *Sipat Edukasyon* in November 2022, via Zoom and streamed live through the UP CIDS Facebook page. Its primary aim is to share ERP's education research output with various stakeholders. Previous presentations covered teacher professional development, ICT studies for education, and gender studies in education, among others. This event is free and open to all.

UsapTayo Language Capture and Ethnography .

The Language Capture and Ethnography research team will organize a brown bag session with Dr. Eufracio Abaya on conducting ethnographic studies with children and families. Discussions will focus on unpacking researchers' existing notions of, and experiences with, ethnographic research. Literature on ethnography, particularly community-based and linguistic ethnographies, will be discussed. The session aims to equip the researchers with a deeper knowledge of ethnography as a concept and as a method of research. It also aims to review initial data collection tools and protocols. Application for ethics clearance will be started before the year ends in preparation for data collection.

UsapTayo Coproduction Study

The coproduction research group will revisit findings from the review of the KCG and stakeholder interviews (with parents). This is to be done alongside the literature review on language and literacy, as well as on coproduction, to inform the design of the oral language program for five-year-old learners. The team will conduct stakeholder interviews with teachers, and their transcripts will be analyzed to help determine existing oral language competencies and activities in the school program/setting. Determining the features and components of the oral language program will be drawn from the review of related literature, validation of the developed recommended oral language framework, and the coproduction process, more specifically, the conduct of the quality circles.



UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

For the second half of 2022, HERPRP will organize consultative meetings to connect and reconnect with

major stakeholders in higher education and extend the program's network. Since there will be changes in the leadership in the Senate, the program expects to meet with the offices of two senators—the Office of Senator JV Ejercito (upcoming Senate Committee Chair on Higher and Tertiary Education) and the Office of Senator Sherwin Gatchalian (Basic Education Committee Chair and Higher Education Committee Vice Chair).

Discussions with other offices, such as the House of Representatives Committee on Higher and Technical Education (CHTE), Commission on Higher Education (CHED), University of the Philippines Los Baños (UPLB) Office for Institutional Development in Higher Education, are also being planned.

These meetings will cover updates on higher education policy directions. In these meetings, HERPRP shall also introduce the program, present its research agenda and activities, and explore possible collaborations with the aforementioned agencies. The Program will also hold a meeting with UPLB College of Public Affairs and Development (CPAf). CPAf has expressed interest in extending its partnership with HERPRP after they successfully published an article in *Adapting to the New Normal Through and Beyond the COVID-19 Pandemic: The University of the Philippines Los Baños Experience*, an HERPRP monograph.

The program will also showcase the outputs of the Batch 1 Research Consultants (Agnes Kristine Arban-Quilinguing, Dr. Allen Espinosa, Kathleen Mai Cardoz, Iva Melissa Magsalin, and Lorenzo Ereñata) in a webinar format this August. Consultants are expected to present their findings in their respective articles, and reflect on their research process to inspire other higher education researchers. Their policy papers cover teacher education, student organization culture, and education service delivery.

Continuing the success of the previous batch of consultants, the program will also focus on onboarding the second batch for 2022. The group is expected to produce twelve (12) policy papers by the end of the year.

Batch 1 Research Consultants (Agnes Kristine Arban-Quilinguing, Dr. Allen Espinosa, Kathleen Mai Cardoz, Iva Melissa Magsalin, and Lorenzo Ereñata) will present their policy papers in the latter half of 2022.

Dr. Allen Espinosa will present "Improving Education Service Delivery in the Philippines: An Assessment of Key Education Policies in the New Normal." Ms. Arban-Quilinguing will share her findings in "Accountability in Preservice teacher education: Do professional standards respond to a quality assurance mechanism that would increase public confidence in teaching?" Ms. Kathleen Mai Cardoz will tackle her paper, "Stack Up: Microcredentials and the Future of Higher Education." Mr. Lorenzo Ereñata will discuss his paper, "Understanding the Self Under Lockdown, Literally and Figuratively (Observations and Suggestions from De La Salle College of St. Benilde)." Finally, Ms. Magsalin will talk about her paper, "Paano Na ang 'Org Culture': A Micro-level Study on Reframing Ateneo de Manila University's Student Organization Culture in the Next Normal."

CONSULTATIVE MEETINGS

September-October 2022

The program plans to coordinate consultative meetings with the following offices as part of expanding the network of HERPRP: (1) Office of Sen. JV Ejercito (expected Senate Committee Chair on Higher and Tertiary Education); (2) Office of Senator Sherwin Gatchalian (Basic Education Committee Chair and Higher Education Committee Vice-Chair); (3) Commission on Higher Education (CHEd); and (4) UPLB Office for Institutional Development in Higher Education.

RESEARCH CONSULTANTS August–December 2022

The program will also focus on onboarding the second batch of consultants in 2022. The group is expected to produce 12 policy papers by the end of the year.

CONFERENCE PARTICIPATION October 2022

The program will join the 15th National Convention on Statistics organized by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) in October 2022. HERPRP will participate as one of the organizers of the Education Statistics (Higher Education) session.

Its role was to monitor the national curriculum, as well as forecast likely influences of shifts in external pressures and issues that may affect curricula. ACTRP also sought to reform assessment practices to incorporate more emphasis on formative assessment and a range of consequential actions that needed to be undertaken. In the past ten years, ACTRP has provided evidence-based advice to the Department of Education (DepEd) and other education stakeholders.

FORUM

Alternative Learning System (ALS) Microcertification Feasibility Study: Dissemination Forum for High Officials January 13, 2022

The first of a series of forums was arranged to disseminate the findings of the study, "Feasibility Study of Micro-certification for the Alternative Learning System (ALS) in the Philippines." Present in the first forum were Department of Education (DepEd) Undersecretaries

January 17, 2022 The research team, together with the Education section of UNICEF and the Bureau of Alternative Education, met with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) Executive Director Ma. Susan Dela Rama and Assistant Executive Director Janet Abasolo of the Certification Office to present the findings of the study, "Feasibility Study of Microcertification for ALS in the Philippines." Dr. Sandra Milligan and Dr. Marlene Ferido emphasized the method in developing the study's assessment frameworks and instruments, which were

found valid and reliable based on the results.

Another forum to disseminate the ALS microcertification study findings targeted the external partners who participated in the different phases of the study. FORUM

The second forum in this series focused on presenting the findings of the microcertification study to ALS implementers. The discussion also emphasized the importance of microcertification for ALS learners. Present in the forum were ALS focal persons, Education Program Specialists for ALS, and teachers from the four pilot DepEd divisions (Manila City, Batangas Province, Davao City, and South Cotabato) who were part of the study. Personnel from the DepEd Bureau of Alternative Education and implementers from nonpilot study sites were also present. Dr. Sandra Milligan, Dr. Marlene Ferido, and Ms. Lalaine Bagui presented the results of the feasibility study.

ALS Microcertification Feasibility Study: Presentation during the 13th Education Forum Meeting February 10, 2022

The research team presented the findings of the study, "Feasibility Study of Microcertification for ALS in the Philippines" during the 13th Meeting of the Philippine Forum for Inclusive Quality Basic Education (Educ Forum). The meeting was attended by representatives from 37 government agencies, development partners, civil society organizations (CSOs), private sector partners, and Educ Forum members. Present in the meeting were 14 DepEd Central Office officials led by DepEd Undersecretary Nepomuceno Malaluan, Assistant Secretary G. H. Ambat of the Bureau of Alternative Education, Dr. Sandra Milligan and Dr. Marlene Ferido. Comments from the audience clarified the features, the assessment framework used, and the implications of the implementation of ALS microcertification. **FORUM** ALS Microcertification Feasibility Study: Presentation during the Educ Forum Series, Episode 5: ALS March 24, 2022

The research team also presented the "Feasibility Study of Microcertification for ALS in the Philippines" during the Educ Forum Series, Episode 5: ALS. This Episode Series was meant to address a broader audience, which included all members of the Educ Forum and the DepEd community: Central Office officials, Education Program Specialists for ALS from different regions and divisions, ALS focal persons, and teachers. Meanwhile, a panel of experts served as reactors, which included Mr. Antonio Sayo, vice-president of the Employers Confederation of the Philippines (ECOP) and Ms. Maria Olivia Lucas, president of E-Net Philippines. The series episode was presented through Zoom and streamed live on Facebook.

WORKSHOP

Workshops to Develop the STEM Framework January 10, 17, and 18, 2022

To help develop a framework for the Philippines's Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Education, specialists from the Bureau of Curriculum Development (BCD) convened a workshop facilitated by ACTRP. The specialists came from three learning areas: Science, Mathematics, and Technology and Livelihood Education. Dr. Ann Osman and Dr. Catherine Pearn, experts from the University of Melbourne, assisted the specialists in the workshop. After presenting the existing STEM frameworks of other countries, BCD specialists defined the framework components that were relevant to the Philippine context.

WORKSHOP

Workshops on Exploring Future Possibilities for DepEd Assessment Systems May 20 and 24, 2022

ACTRP organized two high-level workshops with an international panel to explore the future possibilities for DepEd assessment systems. These workshops had a long-term focus, looking beyond the new administration. They had a chance to hear from international assessment experts about the features of national systems that can better meet the needs of the future and can be applied in a Philippine context. The international panel of experts included Enterprise Professor Sandra Milligan, Ph.D. (Melbourne Graduate School of Education, University of Melbourne); Professor Jimmy de la Torre, Ph.D. (Faculty of Education, University of Hong Kong); Professor Margaret Wu, Ph.D. (University of Melbourne); Professor Jim Tognolini, Ph.D. (Centre for Educational Measurement and

Assessment, University of Sydney); Mr. Michael Stevenson (Educational Expert and Senior Advisor); Mr. Robert Randall (Rob Randall Group Pty. Ltd.), Mr. Chris Harte (Google for Education); and Mr. Peter Adams (Educational Development Global Pty. Ltd.). Directors and specialists of the Bureau of Education Assessment (BEA), BCD, and Bureau of Learning Delivery attended the workshops.

WORKSHOP

Training Workshops on Psychometric Methods for Large-Scale Assessments

May 31, June 2, and June 8, 2022

ACTRP conducted three training workshops on Psychometric Methods for Large-Scale Assessments. The main goal of the workshops was to help the BEA and ACTRP Research Officers learn and understand (1) the complexity of the assessment design of the international large-scale assessments (ILSAs), such as the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA), Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS), and Southeast Asia Primary Learning Metrics (SEA-PLM); and (2) the appropriate way to perform analysis of data collected from such ILSAs. Dr. Margaret Wu served as the resource person for the training workshops. The first session covered the issues and solutions in estimating population characteristics, such as the mean score of a particular country, whereas the second session discussed the concept of plausible values and how they are produced and used. The last session tackled using plausible values to analvze PISA data.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Measuring Learning Loss Based on 21st Century Skills of Filipino Grade 6 and 10 Students During the COVID-19 Pandemic

Technical Assistance to DepEd-Bureau of Educational Assessment

Ongoing

DepEd, through its Bureau of Educational Assessment, is conducting a study on learning loss of Grades 6 and 10 Filipino students during the COVID-19 pandemic, specifically on three 21st-century skills, namely: problemsolving, critical thinking, and information literacy. The scope of ACTRC's technical assistance includes identification of common items to be included in the Computer-Based National Achievement Test (CBNAT), observation of the pilot and field administration of CBNAT, and analysis of data through Rasch analysis and test equating.

STUDY

COVID-19 Education Response Mapping Study: How Asian Education Systems Safeguarded Learning During the Pandemic *In-country Support*

May–June 2022

ACTRP provided support in data collection for the study spearheded by the USAID-RTI-Australian Council for Educational Research. The study aims to look into the education sector's response to COVID-19 among countries in Asia, including the Philippines. Data gathering activities include administration of survey questionnaires to school heads, teachers, and parents through field visits to schools located in "hard-toreach" areas, phone interviews, and online surveys. Key informant interviews with stakeholders were also conducted to explore factors that enabled or constrained teaching and learning during disruption.

TRAINING

Building Basic Assessment Competence of Teachers Assessment Professional Development (Grade 8 and 9 English Teachers) January 11–February 5, 2022

The last batch of training was delivered to English teachers from January 11 to February 5, 2022. A total of 17,122 junior high school (JHS) teachers nationwide (5,654 science teachers, 5,795 mathematics teachers, and 5,673 English teachers) were able to join the Assessment Professional Development program. This represented 61.08% of the original target of 28,032. Pre- and post-tests scores of teachers were computed and analyzed using a paired t-test. Results showed that there were statistically significant improvements on participants' test scores at the end of the training (t (2,346) Science = 14.23, p < 0.05; t (1,493) Math = 14.92, p < 0.05; t (1,325) English = 22.87, p < 0.05).

TRAINING

Professional Development for Teachers of Sustaining Education Reform Gains (SERG) Schools June 21 2022–ongoing

ACTRP, in partnership with the Sustaining Education Reform Gains (SERG) project of Save the Children, is delivering an assessment professional development program to teachers in SERG-supported schools in Regions V, VI, VIII, and X. This is similar to the online

training provided to Grades 8 and 9 English, Science, and Math teachers, but involves, this time around, teachers of all grade levels and different learning areas.

Each topic is discussed asynchronously and summarized synchronously with a question-and-answer portion each week for six weeks until the end of July.

STUDY Technical Assistance to DepEd for the 2022 Curriculum January–June 2022

ACTRP provided DepEd with technical support in preparing learning area shaping papers for the 2022 curriculum. These papers addressed the curriculum review findings and guided curriculum specialists as they refined the curriculum. DepEd presented the changes to the K-10 curriculum to education stakeholders—members of the academe, professional organizations, local and international nongovernment organizations working in the education space, private school associations, and DepEd regional directors and personnel—for their comments and suggestions.

MEETING

Study Visit to the University of Melbourne June 14–22, 2022

The study visit to the University of Melbourne aimed to explore future projects, namely: technology use in low-resourced schools, National Achievement Test (NAT) item banking, microcertification for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), and assessments for students with additional needs. During the visit, the ACTRP team received the Melbourne Graduate School of Education Award for Excellence in Team-Based Research Programs. The award recognizes excellence in team-based research programs building intra- or interdisciplinary collaboration to produce sustained, high-quality research outputs.

EVENT

Evolving the Education Landscape: Celebrating ACTRC's 10th Year *Virtual 10th Year Celebration* June 29, 2022

ACTRP celebrated its 10th anniversary through a virtual event held via Zoom and Facebook Live. Two

presentations were delivered during the occasion: "Current Education Trends that Shape Philippine Education" by Dr. Pam Robertson and "Lessons Learned and Recommendations for Philippine Education" by Dr. Marlene Ferido.

Panel reactions were provided by former DepEd Undersecretary Nepomuceno Malaluan, DepEd ALS Education Program Supervisor Jesusa Perez, UNICEF Chief of Education Isy Faingold, and Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP) Executive Director Elvin Uy. Keynote messages were given by Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) First Secretary Georgina Harley-Cavanaugh, UP Vice President for Academic Affairs Cynthia Rose Bautista, and University of Melbourne Pro-Vice Chancellor Mark Hargreaves.

PROPOSALS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

ACTRP intends to use the next six months to publish articles and policy briefs on the projects undertaken over the years. The articles will focus on the lessons learned, as well as policy recommendations on Formative Assessment, Curriculum Alignment, Mother Tongue Based-Multilingual Education (MTB-MLE) in the Philippines, 21st Century Skills, Language Mapping, Alternative Delivery Mode (ADM), and Science and Mathematics curriculum. Three ACTRP researchers will participate in two conferences on educational measurement and statistics to be held in August and October 2022.

ACTRP has been providing technical assistance to the BEA for their learning loss study. This assistance will continue as BEA seeks to improve its capacity to harness results from national and international largescale assessments.

Meanwhile, for new projects, work on inclusive education (IE) for the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) will commence in August 2022, as well as the provision of technical assistance to the Ministry of Basic, Higher, and Technical Education on curriculum and teacher training.

The IE BARMM project aims to retool Special Education (SPED) centers into Inclusive and Supportive Centers of Learning (ISCLs) to support more effectively learners with disabilities in the Bangsamoro Region. ACTRP will also provide technical inputs in the planning, implementation, and the evaluation of activities and outputs.

The continuation of the review of the senior high school (SHS) curriculum could begin in the second half of 2022 depending on the direction set by the new DepEd administration. ACTRP intends to provide technical assistance to DepEd as it reviews and revises the current SHS curriculum.

Moreover, ACTRP is also part of the Advisory Board on the ALS that crafts the policy guidelines on the implementation of microcertification in ALS programs. This certification can be used for employment and for accessing further educational opportunities. It hopes to continue working on assessment frameworks for other capabilities in the life skills modules of ALS, in addition to communication, and teamwork and cooperation. Frameworks and assessment tools for these areas had been previously developed by the Assessment Research Centre, University of Melbourne and the ACTRP as part of the feasibility study on micro-certification conducted from 2021 to 2022.

ACTRP is also considering providing in-country support to other research organizations to evaluate the impact of interventions delivered by DepEd during the pandemic. Other potential projects include offering online courses on formative assessment for faculty of teacher education institutions who teach assessment courses, as well as for basic education teachers from private schools. There are also requests from DepEd school divisions to provide orientation on the use of formative assessment in self-learning modules that the ACTRP produced in 2021.

ACTIVITIES

Participation in the Advisory Group for the ALS June-October 2022

ACTRP is represented by Dr. Marlene Ferido in the Advisory Group for the DepEd Bureau of Alternative Education Implementation of Microcertification in the ALS Programs. The advisory group is tasked to assist and advise on the guiding principles, assumptions, parameters, and strategies on the phased approach of the nationwide implementation of microcertification in ALS. Republic Act No. 11510, or the Alternative Learning System Act, requires DepEd to develop additional ALS programs targeting specific learners' needs such as the short-term Functional Education and Literacy programs (FELP), Academic-Focused Bridging Programs

(AFBP), and the Indigenous Peoples Education Program. Initially, the starting point for the introduction of microcertification in the ALS shall be the life skills modules, which are anchored on competencies selected from the DepEd ALS K-12 Basic Education Curriculum.

TRAINING

Evaluation of Professional Development in Assessment for Grades 8 and 9 Teachers July-August 2022

ACTRP, as part of the consortium for DepEd's assessment professional development program for Grades 8 and 9 teachers, conducted six asynchronous and synchronous sessions on building basic assessment competence. During the program, assessment items were administered to the participants, and their feedback about the professional development program was also collected. ACTRP plans to process the data to evaluate the effectiveness of the said program.

STUDY PRESENTATION

Presentation of the Findings of Learning Loss Study July 2022

ACTRP will present to the BEA the findings of the comparison between the performance of Grades 6 and 10 learners based on the National Achievement Test (NAT) 2018 and the Computer-Based NAT 2021. In particular, the proficiency level of students will be compared based on the three 21st-century skills, namely, problem-solving, critical thinking, and information literacy.

TRAINING

Training Session on ExamView July 2022

ACTRP will assist and train the Educational Assessment Division of the BEA in creating a central repository of all the test items they have constructed and administered from different assessments using ExamView, an item banking software. This item banking software can be used by BEA to store not only the actual test items but also their psychometric properties such as item difficulty and item discrimination.

TRAINING AND MANUAL DEVELOPMENT Retooling of SPED Centers into ISCLs Project in BARMM

August-December 2022

To ensure that No Bangsamoro Child will be Left Behind, ACTRP will join the consortium of organizations that will assist the Ministry of Basic, Higher, and Technical Education in BARMM to strengthen inclusive education and improve the accessibility of its educational programs. This project will involve the development of manuals; teacher training; and simulation of inclusive education in selected schools.

PRESENTATIONS

National Conference on Educational Measurement and Evaluation and National Convention on Statistics August and October 2022

ACTRP plans to participate in two conferences, namely, the National Conference on Educational Measurement and Evaluation (NCEME) in August 2022 and the National Convention on Statistics (NCS) in October 2022.

ACTRP submitted the research on investigating equating methods applied to the two assessments that were administered in their past projects to NCEME. The results of the secondary analysis of TIMSS data will be presented at the NCS.

OUTPUTS

First, it aims to build the capacity of University of the Philippines (UP) faculty in data science and apply this learned skill to public policy and governance. Finally, it seeks to convene multidisciplinary teams of social scientists, humanists, and scientists to research issues in the public sector.

ACTIVITIES FROM JANUARY TO JUNE 2022

STAKEHOLDER MEETING

Preparatory Meeting for UP Intelligent Systems Institute (UP ISI) February 8, 2022

To advance the understanding of socioeconomic and natural systems (which includes the study of the structure, organization, and complex dynamics of physical, biological, social, and engineered systems), representatives from different units proposed the formation of the UP Intelligent Systems Institute (UP ISI). The establishment of the UP ISI will facilitate transdisciplinary research and advocacy in various areas of study, such as transportation, health, social systems, economics, the digital humanities, public policy, physical, and biological systems.

In line with UP's mandate as the national university, the ISI will perform the following functions: research, extension, advocacy, technology transfer, training, and public communication. It will also bring together expertise from different constituent units (CUs) of the university to create a transdisciplinary environment that includes mathematicians, physicists, computer scientists, data scientists, engineers, linguists, historians, social scientists, and other researchers coming from diverse disciplines and points of view. The ISI will encourage the exchange of ideas and will serve as an intellectual forum that leads to joint research and collaboration. Through a complex systems perspective, it will engage industry, government, and civil society stakeholders in seeking solutions to outstanding scientific and social problems by applying leading-edge techniques from high-performance computing, big data, and artificial intelligence. Member CUs of the Data Science Working Group proposed the creation of the ISI, spearheaded by UP Diliman Chancellor Dr. Fidel Nemenzo.

STAKEHOLDER MEETING

Audit of Local Information Systems and Capacities March 23–25, 2022

The study is part of the local governance studies of DSPPP, which look at the experience of select local government units (LGUs) in improving their information system capacities. The study gathered textual data from discussions with LGUs, utilized data available from the different these LGUs' social media pages via web scraping, and subjected this gatherred qualitative information to quantitative analysis.

The city governments of Marikina, Pasig, and Quezon City served as subjects for data collection. The activity collected valuable pieces of information regarding how the LGUs' digital accounts processed and handled information. The activity focused especially on how they cascaded data for social amelioration and other facets of the pandemic response. The activity also piqued the interest of DSPPP Fellow, Dr. Vladimer Kobayashi, to also look into the e-governance and digitization efforts in Mindanao.

BOOT CAMP

Analysis of Education-to-Labor-Market and Job-to-Job Transitions May 12–13, 2022

The boot camp focused on visualizing transitions and creating a model that can predict probable job transitions in a person's career using historical data of education-to-labor market transitions and job-tojob transitions. The project will build a model using sequence prediction algorithms (such as recurrent neural network and conditional random fields).


STAKEHOLDER MEETING

collaboration, DSPPP will provide the technical needs of the researchers as they implement the research project.

From the exploratory meeting, UP DEPPO proposed to conduct two studies involving data science in the field of culture (*Sikolohiyang Pilipino*) and business analytics. Concept notes are also being finalized, and possible research fellowships in DSPPP by the project leads are expected. This endeavor is expected to produce articles on cultural policy and trade and/or economic policy that would potentially be published in the *Philippine Journal of Public Policy* (PJPP).

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

The Program will continue pursuing activities related to its internal research agenda, particularly on the governance of information systems and labor analytics. It will also commence the activities related to new research projects with the UP DEPPO. The outputs of these research activities will be submitted to the UP CIDS Publications staff. Different capacity-building programs will also be pursued as part of the twopronged thrust of the Program, especially on web scraping of both textual and visual data.

The Program will also continue to serve as a platform for discussion among the different units that are part of the Data Science Working Group and to assist in the preparatory needs for the creation of the UP ISI.

ACTIVITIES

- Continuation of the automatic extraction of job information from job vacancies for job analysis
 - The research project will create an algorithm that automatically detects and

sorts job type information. These pieces of information may include worker attributes (skills, competencies, education), activities, description of the business organization, benefits, and compensation. Consequently, the project will create the first skill taxonomy of Filipino workers in the Philippines.

- The project will also develop profiles of skills and competencies required by companies operating in the Mindanao region. The result will be used to write a policy brief that recommends what skills education institutions should focus on developing in their students. Mindanao offers great potential in terms of manpower; however, many young workers cannot find suitable jobs because either they are not aware of the opportunities or there are mismatches in their education and available jobs in the labor market. This can be addressed by creating a skills taxonomy that can help both the industry and academe match the perfect talent for jobs in demand.
- Establishment as a support platform for UP ISI
 - DSPPP will serve as a potential platform in operationalizing the new UP ISI—stemming from the early work on convening the Data Science Working Group—and concurrently be the secretariat of the working group. As such, it will be involved in the present and future projects and plans for developing the said Institute.
- Training on web scraping for both textual and visual data
 - The new collaboration with UP DEPPO and the expertise in web scraping from the fellows in UP Mindanao provide possible capability-building activities not just for textual data, but also for visual data. DSPPP will bring experts in web scraping and explore policy research activities that may exploit such methodologies.
 - Spearheaded by the research team from UP Mindanao, the possible capacity-building activity will include the use of powerful software and tools for scraping, not just texts

from the internet but also visuals, primarily images and even videos sourced from social media websites (such as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube) and online public forums. Careful consideration for cleaning the data that will be extracted is needed and will also be included in these capacity-building activities.

Program on Escaping the Middle-Income Trap: Chains for Change

The Program on Escaping the Middle-Income Trap (EMIT C4C) examines inclusiveness and competitiveness in its research agenda and in its efforts at working with its partners to address developmental challenges. It undertakes three projects using inclusive science: big data analytics on manufacturing, labor, and exports; action research on agriculture and fisheries value chains; and action research on business-for-peace in Mindanao. EMIT C4C provides learning and partnering platforms for the academe, the government, civil societies, and the private sector to share lessons and act on recommendations.

ACTIVITIES FROM JANUARY TO JUNE 2022

LAUNCHING OF WEBINAR SERIES AND TRAINING Project Management for Camp Transformation Webinar Series Launching March 1, 2022

This activity kicked off the training of former combatants of the North Western Mindanao Front (NWMF) and key community members on project development and management. The keynote speaker was Mayor Eduardo Guillen of Piddig, llocos Norte who spoke about his experiences in developing a municipality-wide plan, which he brought to different agencies for funding support. He also provided ideas on how to identify problems, spot opportunities, and implement various projects. Mayor Guillen underscored the importance of partnering with internal (such as farmers' groups, *zanjeras*, or irrigators' associations) and external (such as national agencies) stakeholders in a project's success.

WEBINAR TRAINING

Project Management for Camp Transformation Webinar Series: Session 1 March 15, 2022

The first session focused on two topics: (a) identification of problems and opportunities in communities, led by Jane Lynn Capacio of EMIT C4C, and (b) the baseline survey, facilitated by Tara Alessandra Abrina, also of EMIT C4C. A number of tools and frameworks were used to discuss the topics. Workshops were held to immediately apply lessons and enable peer learning. The training session received positive feedback from both participants and cotrainers.

WEBINAR TRAINING

Project Management for Camp Transformation Webinar Series: Session 2 March 29, 2022

This session, which was led by Allan Albert Lalisan of EMIT C4C, focused on project design, monitoring, and evaluation. Taking off from the assignments of

the participants, the session discussed techniques for designing projects that are feasible, efficient, and reflective of the communities' needs and aspirations. During this session, EMIT C4C also introduced the baseline survey tool using Kobo. The training participants were then capacitated to become survey interviewers.

BASELINE SURVEY

Baseline Survey for Camp Transformation April 2-May 1, 2022

EMIT C4C developed a baseline survey tool that training participants used to interview heads of households in their base camps in Lanao del Norte and Lanao del Sur. The survey covers the following: household demographics, education, livelihood, employment, and other topics. The total number of respondents is 1,106: 458 of whom are female and 648 are male. Interviewers chose between using the survey's online version or undertaking face-to-face interviews. Since they will be the encoders of the results, those who initially used pen and paper eventually shifted to the online survey. The survey was undertaken during Ramadan.

FACE-TO-FACE TRAINING AND COACHING Project Management for Camp Transform

Project Management for Camp Transformation Webinar Series: Final Session and Graduation June 1–3, 2022

Because of the limitations of blended training, the opportunities provided by the lesser restrictions on travel, and the participants' request to do in-site discussions, the training team decided to undertake face-to-face training in Cagayan de Oro City. Composed of EMIT C4C, Hinelaban Foundation (HFI), Pakigdait Foundation, and the Institute of Peace and Development in Mindanao of the Mindanao State University Iligan Institute of Technology (MSU IIT IPDM), the team recapped prior assignments, validated the baseline survey results, and introduced new topics, such as financial management, moral governance, project implementation, and monitoring and evaluation. They also undertook coaching sessions on the participants' proposals. This series of activities was capped with a graduation ceremony.

Presentation of Action Research Findings June 10, 2022

EMIT C4C presented the final draft of its action research report codeveloped with the Peace and

Equity Foundation (PEF) entitled, "Frameworks that Describe, Explain, and Delight: Using Frameworks and Tools to Enhance Project Assessment with the Laak Multipurpose Cooperative as Illustrative Example." The PEF management appreciated the report's content, as well as the participatory and learning process that went into the project. The paper will be edited to suit a wider audience and will be submitted to PEF for vetting and to UP CIDS for publication.

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

EMIT C4C intends to publish the results of its efforts during the second part of 2022. This involves turning the three action research reports, which were shared with PEF, into UP CIDS publications. EMIT C4C and PEF will generalize the findings and recommendations so that these would become relevant to other stakeholders in the agriculture sector. The publication will form part of the *Going Against the Grain* and *Going Against the Tide* series of EMIT C4C. The series is being developed into a book that synthesizes the lessons on agriculture value chains, inclusive business, and sustainable social enterprises.

Together with PEF, efforts will be made to plan a second loop of action research. This may involve training a core staff from PEF on the use of several tools to gauge program results and flag problems before they escalate. The second loop may also involve the conduct of one or two new case studies.

Pakigdait Foundation, MSU IIT IPDM, and HFI, in partnership with EMIT C4C, will conduct reflection dialogues on "Women Nurturing Peace." This will be participated in by Camp Bilal's Bangsamoro Islamic Women Auxiliary Brigade (BIWAB)-Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF). Professor Yasmira Moner of MSU IIT IPDM will facilitate various discussions around the roles of women in peacebuilding. The narratives from this two-day activity will be documented.

The baseline survey that EMIT C4C developed on business for peace will be cleaned based on the validation session with the enumerators. A baseline report will be submitted to the NWMF-MILF and the project partners, so that these could be used by the base camps to develop enterprises and submit proposals to possible donors. The proceedings of the blended and in-site training on *Project Management for the Camp Transformation Webinar Series* will be submitted to UP CIDS for publication.

The proposed projects of the camps, which they developed through the *Project Management for Camp Transformation Webinar Series*, will be discussed with Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) Member of Parliament (MP) Abdullah Macapaar. During the discussion, EMIT C4C and its partners will also conduct a check-in meeting with the training participants to see the progress of their proposals and the implementation of their projects.


ACTIVITIES

On 9 August 2022, EMIT C4C and its partners held a one-day check-in discussion with the attendees of the *Project Management for Camp Transformation Webinar Series*. In this meeting, the training participants and organizers will present to MP Macapaar the various plans and how these will be supported. Another check-in meeting will be held in December 2022 to monitor and evaluate these projects' progress.

Field research was undertaken in a banana plantation of Unifrutti Tropical Philippines, Inc., an action research partner of EMIT C4C. Data gathering and analysis focused on how the company and the banana growers successfully monitored and prevented the spread of Panana Disease (*Fusarium oxysporum f. sp. Cubense*) in one farm. The lessons from this experience could inform policymakers and help other players in the banana industry.

Between August and September 2022, EMIT C4C and PEF held bimonthly reflection sessions to discuss the development of a second loop of action research. These sessions harvested lessons from the first loop and explored how to develop popular knowledge from the action research reports. A proposal for the second loop will be submitted to PEF for funding by the end of September 2022. During the anniversary of PEF in November 2022, a blended conference will be organized where EMIT C4C's four action research reports will be shared with their partners and stakeholders.

Starting August 2022, EMIT C4C, in collaboration with the Partnerships Resource Centre (PRC) of the

Rotterdam School of Management, will collaborate with the Worldwide Fund for Nature Philippines (WWF PH) in implementing multistakeholder partnerships for sustainable tuna. EMIT C4C and PRC will assist WWF PH in rolling out and analyzing the results of their baseline survey tool on partnerships. Out of the results of the survey, the EMIT C4C and PRC will hold reflection sessions with the staff of WWF PH.

Economic Justice: The Struggle for Economic Equality and Social Emancipation February 18, 2022

Dr. Eduardo Tadem spoke at this webinar organized by the Asia Pacific Social Forum 2022. He discussed what he calls the seven agrarian "pandemics" of the Philippines. He identified the seven pandemics as (1) the COVID-19 pandemic; (2) the country's 1995 accession to the World Trade Organization (WTO); (3) the poor implementation of agrarian reform; (4) the marginalization of poor fisherfolks vis-à-vis large fishing companies; (5) loopholes in the Indigenous Peoples' Rights Act (IPRA), (6) the Rice Tariffication Law, and (7) the impending ratification of the Regional Cooperation Economic Partnership Agreement (RCEP).

ONLINE FORUM

People's Plan for the Twenty-First Century (PP21) Forum on Rural and Indigenous Community Building in Asia February 19, 2022

Ananeza Aban, Senior Research Analyst of AltDev, gave a presentation in this online forum co-organized by the Asian Regional Exchange for New Alternatives. Aban discussed the experiences and alternative practices of Lumad indigenous communities in Mindanao while confronting the alarming expansion of corporate control over natural resources that are also their ancestral domain claims. Citing the Tampakan mining project as a case of Southeast Asia's largest gold and copper reserve, she highlighted the repercussions of lifting the moratorium on new mining permits that will relieve restrictions on open-pit mining.

ONLINE FORUM "Sutra Mandali" (Action-Oriented Dialogue) on Dignified Livelihood 19 February 2022

AltDev Junior Research Analyst Rafael Dimalanta represented the Program in this online forum organized by the Vikalp Sutra under the Asia Pacific Social Forum 2022. Dimalanta shared the experiences of the informal economy workers in Sitio San Roque and the street vendors of the Metro Manila Vendors Alliance. He reiterated that the deep interconnection of struggles in informal work and informal housing experienced by the urban poor is a result of neoliberal urban development in the country, which puts the profit-making agenda of developers in the forefront of housing provision and city planning.

ONLINE MEETING

Global Tapestry of Alternatives (GTA) International Networking March 11, 2022

Ryan Martinez and Rafael Dimalanta from AltDev joined representatives from the Global Tapestry of Alternatives (GTA) in introducing the network to Johnson Yeung and Marc Batac of the Milk Tea Alliance (MTA). In this meeting, Martinez and Dimalanta assisted the GTA in explaining to the MTA the efforts of the Network in weaving different alternative practices throughout the globe.

ONLINE FORUM

Digital Technology and Solidarity Economy in Asia March 30, 2022

AltDev Co-Convenor Asst. Prof. Benjamin Velasco represented the Program in this webinar. He spoke on the impact of digitalization on the working and living conditions of women and workers, and on the need for regulations in the form of digital rights and social protection. Four Issues That Confront the Activation of the Bataan Nuclear Power Plant: An Online Webinar/ Forum in Honor of the Late Roberto "Obet" Verzola May 12, 2022

The AltDev team organized an online activity to surface various issues with the possible activation of the Bataan Nuclear Power Plant (BNPP), as well as to honor the late Robert "Obet" Verzola, who was one of the key figures in pushing for the BNPP phaseout. He was part of the Citizen's Review Panel that first exposed the power plant's dangers. The discussion of Dr. Kevin Rodolfo, the main speaker, focused on the four of the most serious

dangers: geological hazards; carbon dioxide emissions; radioactive wastes; and the impact of its radiation and radionuclide emissions on workers and the surrounding communities.

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

Although limited funds remain a major hurdle for AltDev, the program is resolute in continuing what has been stalled. AltDev aims to pick up where it left off with its projects in documenting, popularizing, and linking alternatives. Activities, however, will still have to adjust to the pandemic and financial situation of the Program. Engagements with grassroots partners will be conducted online unless mobility restrictions in the region are to be relaxed, and funds will be made available.

Nonetheless, AltDev aims to complete its documentation of cases of alternative practices by the second half of 2022. The Program also aims to broaden the regional and sectoral scope of its documentation work. This effort will include cases from Northeast India as well as the alternative practices of workers' organizations and labor unions in the Philippines.

To continue its work in Linking Alternatives through knowledge sharing and solidarity building, the Program shall look into potential engagements with allies made in South Asia through AltDev's engagement in the GTA. AltDev shall explore hosting a people-topeople exchange between grassroots partners in Southeast Asia and prospective partners from South Asia. Restarting the movement-building process of the Steering Committee of the Southeast Asia Network will be one of the most crucial tasks of AltDev this second half of 2022. This is also necessary for planning the Fourth Regional Conference on Alternatives.

The activities of *Lawan*, AltDev's social media project, will also be resumed to continue its work of sharing stories from communities and sparking crossborder solidarity. It also remains to be a vital tool for information dissemination and awareness raising for AltDev and its grassroots partners. In maximizing this, AltDev will seek to cocreate content that features alternative development and other pertinent issues in Southeast Asia.

ACTIVITIES

Documentation of Alternatives

AltDev's documentation work serves as the backbone for the program's subsequent activities. Despite the effects of the pandemic, AltDev has persisted in documenting not just alternative development practices but also COVID-19 community responses. The Program will complete its monograph, *Alternative Practices in the Philippines and Southeast Asia, Volume 2,* which will cover cases from Southeast Asia (including the

42

Philippines) and South Asia. Moreover, the work of AltDev in surfacing these alternatives shall include those previously undocumented sectors: labor, transport, and education.

Participation in International Platforms of Civil Society

AltDev recognizes that the ASEAN Civil Society Conference/ASEAN Peoples' Forum (ACSC/APF) is one of the broadest spaces where civil society can engage with the ASEAN. Together with the Steering Committee of the Southeast Asia Network, AltDev will look to engage with ACSC/APF organizers in the hopes of reinstating the Convergence Space on Alternative Regionalism that was launched during the ACSC/ APF 2020. The Asia-Europe People's Forum (AEPF) is another space that AltDev will maximize since it allows discourse and exchange on Alternatives between Global North and Global South scholars, activists, and practitioners.

People-to-People (P2P) Exchange

Since 2021, AltDev has been involved with the GTA, an initiative seeking to create solidarity networks and strategic alliances amongst alternative development practitioners on a global level. Through AltDev's continuous engagement in the GTA, the Program built contacts with other scholars, activists, and organizers who are doing alternative practices in South Asia and Latin America. AltDev will also explore collaborations to link practitioners based in Southeast Asia with those in South Asia and Latin America through people-to-people (P2P) exchanges.

Movement Building for Southeast Asia Network and Fourth Regional Conference on Alternatives

After the Third Regional Conference on Alternatives, the Steering Committee (SC) of the Southeast Asia Network decided to jointly plan out the necessary structure that will cultivate collective leadership and collaborative undertakings that will highlight the SC members' alternatives. AltDev, functioning as the SC's Secretariat, shall facilitate the process of consolidating the committee. The Fourth Regional Conference on Alternatives will be one of the projects of the SC in the second half of 2022. This fourth installment shall be designed to complement the building of the regional network of Alternatives in Southeast Asia.

For the next six months, the Program plans to: (1) provide technical assistance to PHIC and DOH in the implementation of UHC; (2) continuously update the EMRs; (3) commit to continuous workforce development through monthly UpToDate Club meetings; (4) continuously monitor and support the three study sites; (5) complete Year 3 surveys by August 2022; (6) analyze the year 3 surveys; (7) continue website development; (8) submit our annual report to stakeholders; (9) submit our Year 1 and 2 papers to local and international journals; and (10) submit proposals to stakeholders for future studies.

Site monitoring will still be limited to telephone and online platforms to help prevent COVID-19 transmission and ensure the health of the staff. The electronic health records will continuously be improved to facilitate usercentrism across sites. Community engagement strategies to promote health education, person-centered health policy, and risk-sharing will be further enhanced through print and digital media platforms (such as website development and social media engagement).

ACTIVITIES

- 1. Continuous monitoring of the primary care clinics at the three sites through telephone correspondence and online meetings. The Program will continue to facilitate biweekly team meetings to discuss program updates, funding, manuscript development, site-specific issues, survey progress monitoring, and service utilization across sites.
- Processing and analyzing Year 2/3 survey data across the three sites. Surveys conducted include UpToDate usage, patient satisfaction survey, EHR acceptance and use survey, health care worker satisfaction survey, and outpatient and inpatient service utilization.
- 3. Conducting a monthly primary care training among healthcare workers. This is done through the UpToDate Club.

PHSD will get one volunteer healthcare worker from each barangay in Samal and Bulusan to discuss a topic (illness) that they have encountered in the barangay health station in the past few months. Afterward, a guest doctor will give their recommendations on the chosen topic.

4. Launching community engagement material primarily through digital platforms (such as the PPCS website). PHSD plans to relaunch the PPCS website, which contains information on the basics of primary care. The Program also plans to invite its stakeholders, such as DOH and PhilHealth, to this event.

 - 1 paper on the utilization of benefits across primary care implementation sites
 - 1 paper on the quality of care across primary care implementation sites
 - 1 paper on telemedicine (quantitative and qualitative)





RESEARCH DISSEMINATION AND VIRTUAL PUBLIC LAUNCH #PILIpiLUNAS2022 Governance Agenda: A Public Launch April 29, 2022

In 2021, PSPC, through co-convenors Profs. Atienza and Tigno, collaborated with the UP Diliman Task Force Nation-Building in organizing two webinars discussing the Philippine party system and the 1991 Local Government Code. The policy recommendations from these two webinars are included in the task force's "#PILIpiLUNAS2022 Governance Agenda: *Pagangat at Pagsulong Tungo sa Magandang Buhay at Bukas* (Executive Summary)." It was launched this April 2022 to try to influence policy debates of national and local candidates in the May 2022 elections and future legislation. Profs. Atienza and Tigno also joined the resource persons representing policy areas who gave recommendations.

2022 Planning Officers Conference, Department of Social Welfare and Development May 25–27, 2022


ACTIVITIES

FIELD VISIT AND KEY INFORMANT INTERVIEWS Jawi Studies: Establishing the Intellectual Foundation of Philippine Muslim History (PMH) January 30, 2022

ISP Convenor Asst. Prof. Darwin J. Absari conducted key informant interviews with Sarah Hari, a spiritual master and an expert in *Tarasul* (Tausug mystical expressions). The interviews were conducted in Alicia, Zamboanga Sibugay and Jolo, Sulu.

On March 31, 2022, Absari and his team went to Jolo and interviewed an *imam* (religious leader) who keeps a Jawi manuscript.

PROJECT BRIEFING

The Cesar Adib Majul Posthumous Book Project June 17, 2022, 9:00–10:25 a.m.

Dr. Nefertari A. Arsad led the first briefing of the Cesar Adib Majul Posthumous book project, which includes four reviewers or curators, three library staff, and three program staff, including the ISP convenor, Asst. Prof. Darwin J. Absari. The briefing aimed at providing a background, a set of curating guidelines, and direction for the project. The briefing resulted in the distribution of tasks to the reviewers, the discussion of curation guidelines, and goal setting—all together with the aim of publishing Dr. Majul's unpublished articles, each with an introductory review article of approximately 1,000– 2,000 words that the reviewer/curator will write based on the suggested curation frames.

FIELD VISIT AND KEY INFORMANT INTERVIEWS

Cases of Handling COVID-19 Related Deaths Among Muslims in Metro Manila from March 2020 to March 2022

June 5, 2022, 2:00–5:00 p.m. July 22, 2022 at 2:00–5:00 p.m.

Asst. Prof. Darwin J. Absari conducted a series of key informant interviews with Muslim cemetery personnel, community leaders, and families of Muslims who died of COVID-19 from March 2020 to March 2022. These interviews gathered data that will assess whether the

The interviews also focused on identifying coping strategies and adjustments in the absence of these strategies.

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

The ISP team will conduct a PMH-focused webinar in October, a series of hybrid (face-to-face and via Zoom) meetings on the Majul book project, a series of hybrid (face-to-face and via Zoom) data-gathering meetings, and the writing of research outputs for publication. A number of annotations of Jawi manuscripts, policy briefs, discussion papers, webinar/conference proceedings, and a published book are in the pipeline, with these all expected deliverables in December 2022.

ACTIVITIES

A Face-to-Face Meeting/Webinar for PMH Teachers

This capacity-building webinar aims to continue to develop a database of social networks and shared PMH references among Islamic Studies institutions in the country, including the Institute of Islamic Studies (IIS) in UP Diliman, the Al Qalam Institute (AQI) of the Ateneo de Davao University, the Mindanao State University Systems all over Mindanao, and other private and state colleges and universities. This is scheduled in October 2022 and will be hosted by Asst. Prof. Darwin J. Absari, with the assistance of the ISP staff.

Ongoing Transcription of the Interview Data

Jawi Studies: Establishing the Intellectual Foundation of the Philippine Muslim History

Expected outputs of the Jawi studies project are the annotations of manuscripts and other literary traditions. These efforts continue what Dr. Samuel Tan started in his Jawi studies collection in Mindanao. ISP convenor Asst. Prof. Darwin J. Absari leads this project.

Meanwhile, Dr. Cheery D. Orozco interviewed the hospital staff who provided care and aftercare to Muslim COVID-19 patients prior to their burial.



RESEARCH PAPER

Re-Evaluating Japan's Middle Power Diplomacy: Between Aspirations and Reality May-September 2022

Japan has expanded its security policies, becoming more proactive in regional security affairs. What

are Japan's options for navigating a changing and increasingly volatile regional strategic landscape? Geopolitical observers argue for Japan to adopt a strategy that substantially contributes to maintaining international order and exerts moderate influence in international politics. Several constraints prevent Japan from fully adopting this role, chiefly the lack of coercive military force, the security identity of domestic antimilitarism, and a United States-dependent strategic posture. The paper examines Japan's "middle-power" diplomacy, and the limitations of its regional leadership ambitions, looking into Japan's regional security engagements, its relations with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and other "middle powers" in the region, and the implications of its strategic choices.

Additionally, as teaching aids, these podcasts are meant to deliver complex ideas and convoluted situations in an organized, digestible format.

Foreign Policy Recommendations for the New Administration June–December 2022

The paper addresses the logistical, doctrinal, organizational, and funding concerns not only of the Philippines' military capability but also the country's strategic position. The document looks into imperative foreign policy concerns that the Philippines could face in the near term, both from the regional security perspective and the wider international system.

The paper also offers suggestions and methods for the newly elected government to improve policies and legislation. These recommendations are designed to be used as frameworks in developing stronger bilateral and multilateral security relations, especially to reinforce the Philippines' reputation as a reliable international actor.

UPCOMING ACTIVITIES AND OUTPUTS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

From July to December 2022, SSP expects to finish the recording and publication of the *Katipunan Dialogue Podcast Series*. This also includes the production of accompanying study briefer for each episode and proceedings of the entire series. Even after the podcast recordings and the subsequent publication of all of the episodes, the podcast will continue to be promoted to develop a larger following and as a study aid.

The same effort in finishing the other two outstanding commitments also applies: *Reevaluating Japan's Middle-Power Diplomacy: Between Aspirations and Reality* and *Foreign Policy Recommendations for the New Administration.* The foreign policy recommendations will focus on more long-term benchmarks that the administration may pursue to strengthen the Philippines' security position. In addition, the Japan research project will account for the new geopolitical realities to explore Japan's options in navigating a changing and increasingly volatile regional strategic landscape. All three of these projects are projected to be finished by the beginning of the fourth quarter of 2022. This also includes meeting all financial liquidation commitments both to UP CIDS and external partners. Any remaining holdover projects from 2021 should already be finished by this point.


Katipunan Dialogue Podcast

The remaining episodes to be recorded explore a multitude of topics, including border negotiations between asymmetrical powers and their applicability to Southeast Asia, economic statecraft, and the involvement of external powers in Southeast Asia's regional security environment.

ACTIVITIES PURSUED FROM JANUARY TO JUNE 2022

SPEAKING ENGAGEMENT Ugnay Talakayan: Moral Governance on BARMM's Fiscal and Local Autonomy January 19, 2022

The Ministry of Interior and Local Government of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) conducted *Ugnay Talakayan* in commemoration of the third anniversary of the BARMM's creation. Topics tackled included the importance of creating the BARMM's concept of leadership inspired not by Western ideas; the relationship between the national government and the Bangsamoro government; and the effects and consequences of the Mandanas-Garcia rulings on local government units.

SPEAKING ENGAGEMENT

Executive–Legislative workshop on the Bangsamoro Local Governance Code February 9–11, 2022

This workshop delivered a series of legal opinions and policy commentaries based on different analytical views. Discussions covered, among many others, legal analyses on the Mandanas ruling, advancing the BARMM's economy, environmental issues, sustaining

peace and suppressing violent extremism, and the role of local government units on energy projects.

SPEAKING ENGAGEMENT Research Workshop on Investment in BARMM March 8–11, 2022

Seminar-Forum on Legislative Research, Law Drafting, and Bangsamoro Analytical Cases on Economic Development, Gender Legislation, Peace & Conflict, Non-Traditional Security, and Moral Governance March 14–17, 2022

There were lectures about the policy research template, methods of data gathering, research data analysis, bill drafting, and legal research.

PROPOSALS FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

For the last six months of 2022, DSP will orient its focus on decolonial legislation and minority and identity narratives.

The Program has decided to dedicate time and resources to aim for a Philippine legislative government arm that is sensitive to indigenous issues and is more

knowledgeable about decolonial theory and practice in policy-making. The Program shall also continue holding seminars and collaborating with other institutions in events concerning minorities and identity representation in digital archives.

In order to fulfill these major directives and goals for the first half of the year, DSP currently plans to hold three major activities: a collaboration on an exhibit by the University of Antwerp on minority narratives in the Philippine press from 1895 up to 1945; a twoday workshop on decolonial legislation with the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao's Parliament; and a seminar on digital humanities research on identities.

The exhibit shall showcase the narratives of minorities in Philippine periodicals. The two-day workshop with the Bangsamoro Parliament shall tackle writing policies suitable for the Moro peoples. Meanwhile, the seminar on digital humanities research on identities shall introduce prospective researchers to computer-aided

research on digital archives, and train them on software to aid research. Discussion papers, proceedings, and policy briefs shall be produced after these activities.

Furthermore, the Program also plans to begin establishing linkages with academics and academic institutions devoted to decolonizing their respective fields, and to partner with people and organizations that directly work for and with indigenous peoples in the Philippines.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES FOR JULY TO DECEMBER 2022

University of Antwerp Global Minds Project — Minority Narratives Exhibition: The Philippines and the Filipino Press (1895–1945) Middle or End of August 2022

The Global Minds Project is a collaboration with the University of Antwerp. This week-long exhibition will be held in the Ayala Museum and will feature archived periodicals from 1895 up to 1945 involving various topics, such as the end of Spanish colonialism, the shift from Spanish rule to American rule, the age of capitalism, representations of women in journalism, suffragism, minorities in the Philippines, wars and revolutions, World War II, and literature, among others.

Decolonial Approaches to Legislation seminar September 14–15, 2022

This workshop aims to explore, discuss, and elaborate on the use of decolonial approaches in crafting legislative measures such as bills and resolutions in the Bangsamoro Parliament.

This workshop aims to illustrate the importance of decoloniality in the lived experiences and sociocultural realities of the Moro peoples vis-à-vis the world of policymaking and implementation.

It shall be conducted in either an online webinar or a workshop lasting two days to help ensure a comprehensive and appropriately-aligned lecture on decolonial theory and practice, and on its application to legislation concerning BARMM and the indigenous peoples within its jurisdiction. Identities and Digital Humanities Research seminar November 2022

A two-day workshop split over two weeks that aims to introduce researchers to computer-aided research in digitized archives, with a special focus on minority identities in the Philippines.

Attendees will first learn about developments in the digital humanities and corpus-assisted discourse studies before using digital archives and repositories and open-access tools to explore various minority identities in the Philippines.

Individuals and/or groups will then present their research and talk about the implications of minority representation on social dynamics, policy, and their vision of what it means to be a Filipino.
